	Properly Fitting and Transport Canada Approved Lifejacket or PFD in good condition for each person on board
	<b>Buoyant Heaving Line and / or Lifebuoy with Rope</b> At least 15 m / 49' 3" in length for boats under 24 m
	<b>1 Reboarding Device</b> If freeboard is greater than 0.5 m
	Sound Signalling Device or Appliance

	Visual Signalling Device (eg. flashlight / flares)
	Manual Pump / Bailing Bucket
	Navigation Lights
